CAVALCADE OF JAZZ

80 years ago Leon Hefflin, Sr. started the first large outdoor jazz festival, the Cavalcade of Jazz, in Los Angeles at Wrigley Field. PIJF honors Mr. Hefflin's legacy and entrepreneurial achievements.

Cavalcade of Jazz — started, funded, and produced by entrepreneur Leon Hefflin Sr. (August 17, 1898 – November 20, 1975) — was the first ever large-scale outdoor Jazz festival and took place annually every summer from 1945 to 1958. The Cavalcade was held at the 21,000 seat Wrigley Field in South Los Angeles and featured a wide variety of some of the best-known names in Jazz, including: Lionel Hampton, Nat King Cole, Count Basie, Dinah Washington, Josephine Baker, Louis Armstrong, The International Sweethearts of Rhythm, John Birks "Dizzy" Gillespie, and Sarah Vaughn. The Pittsburgh International Jazz Festival honors Mr. Hefflin's legacy and entrepreneurial achievements.

We celebrate this event not only to highlight a lost history in Jazz, but also to acknowledge and recognize a great trailblazer in black business and entrepreneurship: Leon Hefflin Sr. An exhibition of original materials from Cavalcade will be on display in the PUF Member's Lounge. Additionally, we are so very excited to have Leon's granddaughter, Deborah Swan, at the festival with us. Deborah is an expert in the history of her grandfather and his Cavalcade of Jazz; she will give a presentation on the history of the event Sunday, September 21st, from 1:30pm - 2:30pm in the August Wilson African American Cultural Center's Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation Gallery.




